## Objects and Images

Objects are central to museum displays. Most professional museums obtain objects from their collections, purchase or borrow them from other organizations, or fabricate them. However acquired, objects are the visual devices that carry the storyline of museum exhibitions. Student curators should think of objects as the centerpiece of their display.
